Game on the 28th Nov Was Low On Numbers but High on Runs




There was a small turn out today due to illness and injury. In total we had 12 members in attendance. The teams were

As Group's co-ordinator at the April 2022 members meeting our Gill read out an extract from an article in TAM about Norah and 80 year old from Barnsley who said "I'm not 82 when I am playing walking Cricket I'm 40 again". This article got me thinking about starting a WC group here and it was on the 14th July 2022 we had our first game. Eight of the people who attended that session are still playing with us today and five are here today! (Derek, Chris, Elizabeth, Richard and Gill) Nina came the next session on the 28th as did Mike B and Gail.

Overall, we have averaged 15 (16) per session and we have 35 active members (35) which is 12 ladies (11) and 23 male (24). 6 friendlies plus the York and Bradford events. So, I think we are in good health as a group and continuing to grow and develop.

With gentle strides and careful aim, We chase the ball, relive the game, Each swing and catch, a joy to see, In walking cricket, we are free.


Friendship blooms with every run, Underneath the warming sun. In U3A, we find our cheer, Playing cricket, year by year.
