Book Group

Our first book of the year was *The Architect's Apprentice* by Elif Şafak. The novel recounts the experiences of a young Indian boy who arrives in mid 16th century Istanbul with the gift of a white elephant for the Ottoman Sultan.

The book very much divided the group between those who enjoyed it enormously and others who found it harder to engage with due largely to the extent of arcane detail, particularly relating to architectural styles and designs.

The 'pros' found the story captivating and felt it vividly captured a vibrant and exotic multinational, multi-lingual world full of contrasts between the riches of the Sultan's palace, the poverty of daily proletarian life, the brutality of war and the treatment of slaves. Also evident were the quest for knowledge and the skills of the gentle, learned royal architect Sinan, who as well as being a character in the novel, is a real historic figure. Many of his buildings remain today in Istanbul and other Turkish cities.

Şafak's extensive research and attention to detail are everywhere present within the story, adding to the enjoyment for some of us, while for others making it a less captivating read.

We appreciated the beauty of the descriptive writing, verging on the poetic at times.


