We have had a busy time over the summer. Starting on July 24th with an Introduction to Basic Tapestry Weaving. Simple cardboard frames were used to produce small samples which were then used to make bookmarks, cards, coasters etc.

August then started with another 'Introduction to...' session this time the topic was working on plastic canvas. A variety of stitches were applied to a range of sizes and shapes of the plastic canvas. The results included place mats, hanging decorations and key rings. This technique was continued on September 4th when the techniques that had been learned were used to make 3D items.

The session on August 21st was a complete change as we returned to using Brusho pigments, this time with bleach to produce pieces that could be used in card production or simply displayed as pieces of artwork.

The upcoming topics are Working with Beads, followed by making a Christmas Cracker and then making a Halloween Pumpkin.

Practical Art

For our 1st session back after the summer break we decided to work mainly in black and white using fine line felt tips, old fashioned Quink Ink and dip in pen nibs, sticks, etc. to create a variety of marks to suit our chosen subject matter. We then went on to use the marks in a black and white art work.

Psychology

We met to hear Vivienne talk to us about R.D. Laing, (1927 - 1989) who qualified as a medical doctor before specialising in mental health. He became part of the Anti-Psychiatry movement, who criticised bourgeois society which wanted to impose excessive treatments such as electro convulsive therapy and insulin shock treatment on people suffering mental distress, in order to make those sufferers 'fit' with society.

He became a controversial figure for advocating the use of cannabis and LSD. Whilst working at Kingsley Hall, a London community clinic, he developed a radical approach to the treatment of patients - no locks, no meds - a safe space for people to work through their difficulties. He believed that

schizophrenia came about through the internal creation of a false self, the disjunction giving rise to the symptoms.

Society was experiencing great upheaval at this time, so his iconoclastic beliefs were at first welcomed on both sides of the Atlantic. After a time, his personal behaviour became out of control and he fell from grace. Nevertheless, his holistic approach and gentler methods are, thankfully, still with us today.

Quiz

The August Quiz group meet was held as usual on the fourth Thursday of the month at Tod Methodists where we were treated to an excellent quiz which featured rounds about 'Firsts', 'Seconds', 'Thirds' and so on, which was an unusual approach which gave us a fascinating session.

Next month we will again be meeting in Tod Methodists on the fourth Thursday (September 24th) at 10:15am
